





The signing of the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) was held on June 2, 2022 at Tita's Café along J.C. Aquino Avenue.

Adopt-A-Forest Project is a 3-year tree planting and “parenting” project undertaken by BCWD which will serve as a model project for those individuals, institutions and organizations that would like to conduct tree planting activity and/or just donate or provide funds for one hectare or more hectares to be reforested in TRWFR. It will take ₱75,000.00 to reforest one hectare of the TRWFR, however, donors can opt to donate ₱30,000.00 per hectare and BCWD will provide the additional fund to complete the ₱75,000.00 requirement.

BCWD RECEIVES RECOGNITION for its effort in PROTECTING THE TAGUIBO RIVER

Butuan City Water District (BCWD) received a Plaque of Recognition from Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) on June 20, 2022 during its 2nd Regional Management Conference held in The Pavillion Watergate, Butuan City.

BCWD was recognized for its outstanding contribution leading to the conferment of Taguibo River as 3rd Placer in the national search for Recognizing Individuals/Institutions Towards Vibrant and Enhanced Rivers or R.I.V.E.R.s for Life Award FY 2021 through its community effort towards the management and protection of Taguibo River for a clean and sustainable water flow.

It has been BCWD's advocacy to conserve and protect the environment, in general, and the Taguibo Watershed Forest Reserve (TRWFR) and Taguibo River in particular. It goes down to the grassroots by conducting information and education campaign (IEC), educating the people living in the watershed on the importance of healthy environment and the critical role played by the TRWFR in the lives of the Butuanons. It spearheads and sponsors the solid waste management project at Tagkiling, Anticala, resulting to the maintenance of cleanliness and beautification of that part of the watershed, thereby, avoiding contamination of the Taguibo River. Its reforestation program has reforested about 300 hectares in the watershed area, including the 69 hectares of Adopt-A-Forest project.

Adopt-A-Forest Project is a 3-year tree planting and "parenting"

project undertaken by BCWD which will serve as a model project for those individuals, institutions and organizations that would like to conduct tree planting activity and/or just donate or provide funds for one hectare or more hectares to be reforested in TRWFR. It will take ₱75,000.00 to reforest one hectare of the TRWFR, however, donors can opt to donate ₱30,000.00 per hectare and BCWD will provide the additional fund to complete the ₱75,000.00 requirement.

As of 1st quarter of 2022, BCWD has a total of 69 hectares reforestation project in TRWFR under the Adopt-A-Forest program with 35 generous donors. The result of the latest maintenance activity conducted shows more than 90% survival rate of the planted seedlings. Thus, meeting the 85% survival rate target of said program.

The theme, **“Water Governance Towards Building a Better Normal,”** was aptly adopted to exemplify the real situation in the water supply sector today. Water governance refers to the political, social, economic and administrative systems in place that influence water use and management. Climate change, increasing customer demands, declining per capita water availability, deteriorating water

quality, financial stress and water security are among the challenges currently faced by water districts. The COVID-19 pandemic aggravated the situation. Good governance and management are essential to ensure the fulfillment of the mandates of the water districts and to enable them to adapt to the needs of the times, thereby, building a better normal. This convention highlighted approaches addressing issues faced by WDs, experiences and best practices, and technological solutions, among others.

Pre-event sessions included Local Water Utilities Administration (LWUA) – Water Districts (WD) Dialogue


and Well Development and Groundwater Management, and Workplace Productivity happened during Day 1 on June 15, 2022. Issues and concerns between the LWUA and the water districts regarding funding, loan applications, and prevailing policies were threshed out, clarified, or resolved during the Dialogue.

Learning sessions included topics in water security, water demand management, planning for better normal, water governance, innovation, and digital transformation of WDs.

With the Products / Services Exhibition and various learning sessions during the 3-day event, the Convention aimed to improve water district management and operation as the country eases into a new and better normal.

The Convention kicked off with a Sports Event on June 14, 2022 where some general managers of water districts competed in basketball, volleyball, and lawn tennis tournaments. Water district plumbers showed off and competed





in the 9th Tap and Drill Skills Olympics on the following day, where Butuan City WD placed 4th, La Carlota City WD on 3rd place, Tagum WD was 2nd place, and Metro Kidapawan WD was declared champion.

The PAWD 43rd Convention formally opened on June 16th, following the opening of the products exhibit. Eileen L. Dela Vega, OIC – Administrator of Local Water Utilities Administration, addressed the attendees as keynote speaker. The PAWD General Assembly and election for the Executive Vice President were held in the afternoon. Attendees were treated to a night of songs and dances as they were catching up with old friends and meeting new ones in the evening during the fellowship night.

The last day of the Convention brought learning sessions to the attendees, as well as awarding ceremonies for water district GMs and Board members who have been in service for 10, 15, and 20 years. The induction of the new set of PAWD Officers and formal turn-over of responsibilities were held in the evening before the closing ceremonies.

Indeed, PAWD is a community of those working in the water industry, we're more than an organization – we're a family, a movement, a culture for participants, suppliers and stakeholders.

SPECIAL PROJECT

The Construction of **WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM FOR BUTUAN CITY RURAL BARANGAYS** PROJECT OF LGU BUTUAN AND BCWD in a nutshell





The Butuan City Water District (BCWD) and the City Government of Butuan entered into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for the collaboration on the Detailed Engineering Design and implementation of the Project **“Construction of Water Supply System for Butuan City Rural Barangays”** on December 2, 2019. The said Project aims to provide access to safe water for its constituents especially those residing in far flung rural barangays where BCWD can no longer serve.

Initially, there were 25 beneficiary barangays with a total of 26 water system projects proposed by the City Government of Butuan. The assigned Technical Staff from BCWD started with the preparation of the Detailed Engineering Design (DED) through the conduct of Preliminary Activities, Topographic Survey and Hydraulic Simulation/Design of Pipelines. Estimate of Material Quantities, Construction Schedule and Final Design Report were also prepared for the approval of the City Mayor.

On June 1, 2021, out of the 26 water system projects, 12 DEDs were completed.







Non-Revenue Water (NRW) is a persistent problem of water districts. It is the difference between the volume of water being produced and the billed consumption of the consumers. These volumes of portable water are lost along the pipe network of a water utility before it reaches to the meters of the consumers. NRW is a service indicator and an important aspect in prioritizing water system improvement.

WHAT'S UP

The Butuan City Water District (BCWD) adopted a long term solution in addressing arising issues on the NRW. One of which is the establishment of District Metered Areas (DMAs). DMAs are clusters of systems within the pipe network at large. The main function of the clusters is to narrow down or prioritize the areas to be monitored by the maintenance of a water utility. BCWD started its DMAs in 2017.

Within the four (4) years since it started its DMAs, the NRW team of BCWD is currently managing and assessing four (4) operational DMAs namely: Banza + Maug, Buhangin + Mahay, Mahogany and Tiniwisan + Cabcabon.

DMAs Banza + Maug and Buhangin + Mahay were established in 2017 and have an average NRW level of 14% or 1,782 cu.m and 20% or 4,036 cu.m. respectively, for year 2021. Additional operational DMAs:

Mahogany and Tiniwisan + Cabcabon started in July 2021.

As part of the DMA management, the NRW team of BCWD is conducting data gathering such as tagging of service connections by the use of handheld GPS which include: tagging of existing and new service connections within the DMA, verifying water meter numbers, number of persons per household and analysis of consumption pattern (billed volume) for each concessionaire.



For the year 2021, the BCWD's NRW team tagged a total of 14,679 water meters in 15 barangays namely: Brgy. Baan Km. 3, Brgy. Ampayon, Brgy. Bonbon, Brgy. San Vicente, Brgy. Lemon + Pigdaulan, Brgy. Pianing, Brgy. Antongalon, Brgy. Maon, Brgy. Pangabugan, Brgy. Villa Kananga, Brgy. Taguibo, Brgy. Baan Riverside, Brgy. Bading + Doongan, and Brgy. Villa Kananga. The team did not only focus on the four managed DMAs, but also included other barangays in the tagging of service connections.

In addition, BCWD's NRW team also performs active leak detection by walking through the line and detects leaks that are visible or with the use of a device to detect hidden underground leaks. Detected small leaks were repaired on site immediately while major leaks were reported and repaired the following day.

For CY 2021, a total of 475 leaks were found, during the active leak detection activity.

By December 6, 2021, one (1) barangay water system project was completely approved (*Water Source Development Plan*) since the DED of its distribution line was indorsed by the City on April 08, 2021.




On May 27, 2021, the City Engineer's Office advised BCWD to prioritize implementation of eight (8) barangay water system projects, namely: (1) Barangay Pianing, (2) Barangay Anticala, (3) Barangay Maibu, (4) Barangay Maguinda, (5) Barangay Don Francisco, (6) Barangay Manila de Bugabus, (7) Barangay Los Angeles, and (8) Barangay Aupagan.



By July 15, 2021, the project assigned staff commenced with the mobilization of the project through the conduct of the Pre-Construction Conference in each of the seven (7) beneficiary barangays, with the exception of Barangay Anticala, due to a water source ownership issue.

A total of 12,306 people will benefit from this project with a total of 2,156 service connections and 203 public faucets upon completion of this project.

Presently, the implementation of the project is at 34.79 percent.

BCWD having the absorptive capacity to construct a water supply distribution system because of the presence of the necessary tools and equipment needed was chosen by the City Government of Butuan to enter into a MOA for the implementation of the said project because it is more efficient and economical.
